



Marietta Grassroots 2019 Marietta Music Festival September 21-22, 2019 Band Application

Thank you for applying to the 2019 Music Festival put on by Marietta Grassroots Inc.! We are a not-for-profit 501c3 organization that hosts events around Marietta to bring the community together.

The Music Festival is partnering with the Marietta Street Fest for two fun-filled days of events. The bands that are selected will have the opportunity to play in front of large crowds (Saturday-total estimation: 10,000-12,000), sell their merchandise, and gain recognition. Keep in mind this is not a paying gig, but an opportunity for your band to play on the square, get its name out there, or sell CD's and merchandise.

Bands must meet certain qualifications to be a part of the music festival:

- Band to be based out of metro Atlanta area
- Must have all-age appropriate music
- Live music must be played (no recorded tracks)
- No Cover Bands
- Original music must make up the majority of the set (See: No Cover Bands)

Full Bands will play on: **Saturday, September 21st from 3pm-9pm**

Singer-songwriters or Acoustic Bands will play on: **Sunday, September 22nd from 1pm-5pm**

If you meet the above qualifications, read below for more information:

Genres

This is a music festival for all types of genres. Groups/Artists will be selected based on the quality of the music submitted, not based on a genre of music.

Selection Process

All bands/acts interested in participating must send a completed application, a suggested \$30 non-refundable super-appreciated donation*, and a minimum of 3 songs either on cd, mp3, or video via mail, email or web-link. All applications and songs must be received by August 4th, 2019. Songs sent in must be similar to the songs played the day of the festival.

Keep in mind, we select off of what we are given. If you have a video that captures the essence of what you do better than a recorded track, by all means submit it.

Playing Time

Selected Full Bands (Saturday) and Singer/Songwriters (Sunday) will play on the main stage and will perform a music set of 45 minutes. A minimum of 4 songs and a maximum of 9 songs may be played. Exact time allotment will be revealed 3-4 weeks before the show. These performance times are non-negotiable and will be enforced.

Sound System

Saturday Bands will use a main sound system (provided by Marietta Grassroots) and are expected to play through it. Microphones, DI boxes and floor monitors will be provided. A basic drum kit will be provided. It is the responsibility of each band to bring its own instruments, effects, and amplifiers (if needed). Acoustic and vocal acts will be expected to use mic'd sound for amplification.

Sunday Bands will use a main sound system (provided by Marietta Grassroots) and are expected to play through it. Microphones, DI boxes and floor monitors will be provided. A Drum Kit is NOT provided. It is the responsibility of each band to bring its own instruments, effects, and amplifiers (if needed).

Set-Up/Breakdown

Acts/Bands are required to set up their own equipment within a 10-minute time period. Breakdown is also limited to 10 minutes. Keep in mind your act will be setting up while another is breaking down.

Sound Check

The music festival will begin at the times listed above. Bands are required to be at the stage for sound check that afternoon. A specific time will be assigned upon acceptance. Please plan on being at the Marietta Square by 12pm noon.

Merchandise Sales

Bands will be allowed to set up one (1) table along the perimeter of Glover Park for merchandise sales. Set up and break down of the table is the sole responsibility of the band. Any trash, debris, merchandise and tables left at the conclusion of the festival will be discarded or become the property of Marietta Grassroots, Inc. Bands will be required to adhere to all city and state laws regarding merchandise sales.

What's the Point of the Marietta Grassroots Music Festival?

We at MG love music. In fact, most of the people you'll encounter that volunteer to help out on festival day are musicians or love the arts. We appreciate people like you – the ones who make music for the rest of us to listen to. So, we created a day of music and rent out the Marietta Square to give you an opportunity to display your craft and your skills in front of the folks of Marietta.

Why Don't the Bands Get Paid?

Simple answer: there isn't enough money in sponsorship. It takes a lot of money to make the festival happen as it is, and a lot of people give their time, money and energy to make the festival happen. MG isn't anyone's "job" – we do this because we love local music. We would love to pay the bands; unfortunately, it isn't in the cards right now.
